

TO ALL STUDENTS OF 5th YEAR AND THEIR PARENTS TO TEACHERS OF THE SECONDARY CYCLE

INFORMATION REGARDING CHOICES FOR6th AND 7th YEAR

The pupils' timetable must comprise a minimum of 31 periods and an advised maximum of 35 periods weekly (depending on choices, this may be exceeded), and is made up of compulsory courses and, based on the pupil's own choices, optional, advanced and complementary courses.

NOTE:

- a) The 2-period Biology Course is not compulsory if the pupil chooses to follow any of the 4-period science options Physics, Chemistry or Biology.
- b) Each of the 2-period courses in Geography, History and Philosophy is compulsory unless the pupil selects the corresponding 4-period option.
- c) The morale/religion course must be taken in the pupil's L2. In general, a morale/region course can open for a minimum of 7 pupils. (ref. Doc.: 2019-04-D-13-en-4: 2.4. Minimum group/class/option sizes)

NOTE:

- a) Each pupil must choose at least two optional courses.
- b) Before choosing an option in Year 6, a pupil must have obtained satisfactory results in that subject in Year 4 and Year 5. The choice of optional subjects is particularly important, so it is necessary to consult the teachers concerned and heed their advice.
- c) <u>Choice of Languages</u>: In principle, there are no changes on entering 6th Year. In exceptional circumstances, with the approval of the Direction and the Class Council and following the passing of a test, some changes may be allowed.
- d) If a change in first foreign language (L2) is accepted, the pupil's vehicular language (language used for history and geography) may under no circumstances be changed in Year 6 and 7.

NOTE:

- a) Advanced courses offer a more intensive study of the subject and should be chosen only by pupils who possess a strong interest in and aptitude for the subject. They are not support lessons.
- b) Advanced courses are compulsory examination subjects for the Baccalaureate.
- c) Advanced Mathematics is reserved for pupils who are already enrolled in the 5-period Mathematics course.

NOTE:

- a) Complementary courses are only compulsory for those students who do not reach the minimum 31 periods through basic, optional, and advanced courses.
- b) Complementary courses are not examined as part of the Baccalaureate.
- c) Art and Music cannot be taken as complementary courses if already chosen as optional courses.

General Observations

If an optional course cannot be established in the language of the section, it will be offered in one of the vehicular languages.

If it is not possible to provide the 4-period optional course in History and/or Geography in the pupil's vehicular language, these courses can be taken in another vehicular language, provided that this is not the pupil's L1 and subject to the approval of the teachers concerned.

The Economics courses are organised in Language 2. In the transition from 5th to 6th Year, the language of the course is sustained.

Optional and supplementary courses may be organised if there are at least 5 pupils enrolled.

Please note that it will not be possible to change optional or complementary courses after final choices have been made.

In truly exceptional cases, the school may authorise a change of choice in S6 <u>within the first two weeks</u> of the school year.

Changes that affect the organisation of courses will not be permitted.

Under no circumstances is it possible to drop a course at the beginning of 6th year that was established with the minimum necessary number of pupils.



Changes between 6th & 7th years

A subject chosen for Year 6 and Year 7 can be dropped only at the end of 6th year and only if the following conditions are satisfied:

- 1. The pupil's timetable must still consist of a minimum of 31 periods.
- 2. The pupil must continue to follow two optional courses.
- 3. The pupil must have at least 29 periods of compulsory and optional courses.
- 4. A course studied in Year 6 may not be replaced by a course not studied in S6.
- 5. The pupil must keep at least one science subject. (4-period Biology, Chemistry or Physics, or 2-period Biology).
- 6. If a pupil wishes to <u>drop a subject</u>, a written request must be submitted to the Deputy Director by mid-June and prior to the Class Council.
- 7. A change of level in a particular subject is only possible with strong justifications.

A written request presenting all necessary justifications must be submitted to the Deputy Director by mid-June at the latest, prior to the Class Councils. (cf. article 4-2 of the Regulations for the European BAC)

- Requests for a derogation at the end of Year 6, concerning a level or language, must be approved by the Class Council. Requests are then examined by the Director, who is responsible for the final decision.
- The changes of choice are:

Mathematics 5 → Mathematics 3

Optional 4 periods → Compulsory course of 2 hours (same subject)

The change in the other direction is conditional on the successful completion of a test. certifying the pupil's aptitude to follow the required course/level.

The substitution of one optional course with another is not permitted.

Please take note that pupils in Year 7 must indicate their choice of subjects for the written and oral exams, which they will submit to the BAC, at the beginning of their S7 school year (end of September).

Article 4.2: In every subject, the examination papers must be taken at the level and in the language in which they have followed the course in S6 and S7.



Written Examinations in 6th Year

- 1. 1st series at the end of December.
- 2. 2nd series at the end of the school year.
