Art Design Week

Once again this year, the European School of Varese participated in Varese Design Week 2025 (IX° edition), which was held from 25 to 28 September 2025. This year's theme was 'La Gabbia'. Among the highlights was the sculpture "The Human Condition" by renowned artist Marco Benedetti, the futuristic "Skyscrapers of the Future" by Alberto Talarico, and the immersive 'Freedom' that featured live butterflies in a 'cage' spectators could walk through.

Our Director, Ms. Farinelle, was proud to represent our school at the inauguration event at Piazza Monte Grappa, which kicked off an exciting calendar of events, talks, and performances, and the transformation of our historic squares and courtyards into striking art installations.

A group of our own talented **peer-to-peer students** played an active role in the week's events, offering their guidance and accompanying visitors on their discovery of the art works and installations. The involvement of our students is a real privilege and a source of pride. They demonstrated their artistic knowledge with confidence, and did a fantastic job of representing our school community







European Day of Languages

The theme for this year's 'European Day of Languages' was "Languages open hearts and minds!", which inspired many interesting projects across the cycles. Two of these are featured below.

The project "Lingua mia, fatti capanna: Giving voice to silent books," was conceived by Prof. Stefania Poverino in collaboration with Prof. Giuditta Grolla, European Spirit Coordinator. The activity engaged primary and secondary school classes in a shared reading and creative writing workshop. Silent books, wordless books with a universal language, allowed students to explore visual storytelling as a tool for inclusion, creativity, and intercultural growth.

The initiative was organised with the collaboration of the libraries of the Primary School (Michela Marinello) and the Secondary School (Francesco Scomazzon), as well as the student Emma Montaleone (S5itaA) and the students Eleonora Bonato, Serena Catiglioni, Lucretia Piva and Andrej Sobolev (S3itaB).





After an initial phase of reading and reflection, the students created original texts inspired by the images in the silent books and shared their work in a final moment of exchange and collaboration. This experience was rich in creativity, cooperation, and European spirit, which highlighted how languages can truly open hearts and minds.



Another project, 'Heart and Spirit' saw senior students conduct research into renowned international writers and artists, to find quotes featuring the words 'heart' and/or 'spirit'. Art teachers and students then transformed these quotes into beautiful textured displays.



Visit of a German Brass Orchestra





In October, we had the honour of hosting a German Brass Orchestra from Modellschule Obersberg.

Students in **P5**, **S1** and **S2** (and many fortunate staff members) were enthralled by their outstanding concert performances in the Aula Magna, which included vibrant instrumentals of well known and modern melodies.

Erasmus Maris

From 15 to 19 September 2025, nine of our **S6 students**, accompanied by teachers Charlotte Dudal and Koen Quintens, participated in **Erasmus Maris Week at Borriana** (Spain). This event was organised by the MARIS network, a European collaboration between educational, scientific and nautical centres, and its goal is **to harmonise the monitoring of microplastics in marine environments.**

Over the week, students and teachers from seven European Schools were engaged in hands-on training in sampling and analysing microplastics, hosted by the Escola de La Mar Burriana. Students develop new skills in nautical settings and in classroom sessions that were transformed into scientific laboratories.

Our participation helps us deepen our understanding of marine pollution, scientific methods, environmental citizenship, and international cooperation. The knowledge and experience we gain can then be shared with the school community, with the hope of inspiring further projects and raising awareness about marine microplastic contamination.

We are proud to represent Varese in this European initiative, and look forward to expanding ideas, data, and connections.

Examining animal behaviour.


Examining biodiversity

S6 and S7 Microelectronics students are participating in "Terra Rara," a project promoted by the Municipality of Varese in collaboration with Karakorum Teatro, which combines science, art, and environmental education. The goal is to raise awareness among students and the public about the importance of recycling electronic waste (RAEE) and reducing environmental impact.

Starting after the break and until November 27th, a RAEE collection container will be available at school, located near the columns. Students will prepare informational posters and actively participate in the collection campaign, making a tangible contribution to our Green School's sustainability efforts.

The collected material will subsequently be used to create a contemporary artwork by artist Livia Paola Di Chiara, created at the Molina Foundation and then exhibited at Palazzo Estense during the Christmas season, as a symbol of the participatory circular economy and sustainable creativity.

Thank you to Matthew Pye for passionately sharing his commitment and vision, and to Fenia Tsompanopoulos for promoting this important educational initiative in our school.






Erasmus School Exchange



As part of the Erasmus+ project Strategic Partnership for Schools, we recently hosted two groups of Slovak students from the Evangelic Grammar School in Banská Bystrica. Over two weeks, they visited multiple classrooms and subjects, made new friends, and experienced authentic school life here at the European School of Varese.

This mobility marks the continuation of the successful collaboration between our two schools and aims to strengthen intercultural understanding, enhance language skills, and encourage cooperation in a European context through joint learning experiences and class visits.

Gina, La Panchina

The European School of Varese has recently welcomed "GINA, La Panchina," an initiative that brings together colour, creativity, and core values. In collaboration with the organization HELPIS, creator of the "Yellow Bench® against bullying" project, two cheerful yellow benches have been installed on the school grounds.

These benches, symbols of kindness and respect, represent a tangible message against bullying and cyberbullying. Each bench is uniquely numbered and included in the national map of yellow benches, creating a symbolic connection among all Italian schools participating in the project: a true network of kindness and inclusion that spans the country.

October was a month of creativity and reflection at the European School Varese. For the International Day of Non-Violence, celebrated on October 2nd, Primary P5 and Secondary S1 students collaborated in an activity with strong symbolic value: the decoration of "GINA the Bench." A simple yet meaningful gesture that transformed an everyday object into a message of peace, empathy, and solidarity.

The students also created an artistic and creative program to share their commitment:

- Performances of the songs Be Kind and Toi plus moi,
- Poster presentations with anti-bullying messages,
- Screening of the stop-motion video 'Unity Wins'
- Demonstration of a Friendship Handshake,
- 😽 Drama performance entitled Don't Be a Bully!

Teachers, students, and guests were moved by the sincerity, enthusiasm, and dedication of the young participants. With initiatives like this, the European School of Varese continues to promote values of respect, inclusion, and kindness, building every day an environment where every student can feel welcomed and valued.















In September, girls from **S4 classes** attended a special **breast care session in the** Aula Magna hosted by **Eva De Groeve**, a former student who is currently undertaking a degree in medicine.

The **"Busted" project** aims to raise awareness among younger generations about breast cancer risk factors and the importance of prevention and early diagnosis. Through a hands-on workshop, the students learned how to perform self-examinations using filled balloons and created a mini informational booklet and a personal check-up calendar.

It is estimated that one in eight women worldwide will develop breast cancer during her lifetime, but early diagnosis significantly increases the chances of cure and survival.

A huge thank you to Eva De Groeve for sharing the knowledge, tools, and awareness essential for self-care with our students.







Classroom Spotlight



A Nordic Podcast



Swedish and Danish S7 students are working together on a podcast about the importance of Nordic literature in the process of dismantling traditional gender roles in the 1880s.

The podcast will be entered in a Danish competition for High school students about Nordic literature in November. As well as honing their skills in audio production and scriptwriting, this creative project nurtures cross-cultural appreciation and communication.

A Latin Escape Game

Professor Benaouda's Latin students enjoyed an original escape game based on the chapter "The Origins of the Roman Republic".

Once inside the classroom, the students had to gather all the clues to formulate hypotheses about what might have happened inside. They then questioned the witnesses, translating the depositions written in Latin into French. Finally, they verified their evidence by analysing Botticelli's famous painting, "The Tragedy of Lucretia." Our little detectives solved the case with great enthusiasm!


